Illness Policy

Please respect the other children, staff, and our efforts by keeping your children home when they have a contagious illness. These illnesses include: vomiting, fever of 100.4 degrees or above, diarrhea, pink eye, or anything else deemed contagious by your child's physician. We are always glad to have the children back to daycare once they are symptom and fever free without Tylenol/Motrin for 24 hours.

Rate Increase

We will be increasing childcare weekly rates this year by \$10. The rates will increase from \$250 to \$260 for infants and toddlers, from \$235 to \$245 for 2 yrs. and up, and part time from \$210 to \$220. The first payment reflecting this amount will be Friday, January 2rd.



SNOW POLICY

If Fayette County Schools are closed or delayed due to SNOW or ICE, we will be delayed until 8:00 am. This usually allows enough time for the snow to melt and the roads to clear. We want our teachers, parents, and children to arrive safely. If roads do not seem safe by 8:00am or conditions become more hazardous, we will close for the day. Delays and closing information will be broadcasted on WKYT channel 27, the WKYT weather app, and our Procare App. Be sure you have allowed "push notifications" so you will receive these announcements.
